



- *Between 300-1300 AD Anasazi, ancient ones, lived in cliff houses in Southern Utah.
- *In 1776, Escalante and Dominguez, Catholic priests, were the first white men in Utah.
- *In 1825, a mountain man named Jim Bridger discovered the Great Salt Lake.
- *The Mormon Pioneers arrived in Utah in 1847.
- *Utah's first request for statehood was 1849, it became a territory in 1850.
- *Utah became a state on January 4, 1896.
- *The telegraph lines across the U.S. were connected in Utah in 1861.
- *The Transcontinental Railroad was joined in Utah on May 10, 1896.
- *The Winter Olympics were held in Salt Lake City in 2002.
- *Two Indian chiefs who were responsible for major Indian wars with pioneer settlers were Wakara and Black Hawk.
- *The first governor of Utah (as a territory) was Brigham Young.
- *Utah's first name was the state of Deseret.
- *Utah became the 45th state of the U.S..
- *States that border Utah: Idaho, Arizona, New Mexico, Wyoming, Colorado, Nevada
- *3 Important Lakes in Utah: Great Salt Lake, Bear Lake, Utah Lake
- *Utah's highest peak is King's Peak.
- *Lake Bonneville covered much of Utah 13,000 14,000 years ago. The Great Salt Lake is a remnant of this lake.
- *Utah has 29 counties.
- *The Colorado river becomes Lake Powell.
- *There are two mountain ranges in Utah The Wasatch Mountains (run north/south) and The Uintah Mountains (run east/west)
- *Coal is found in Utah (mostly in Emery and Carbon Counties)
- *Kennecott Copper Mine is the largest open pit mine in the world located in Utah.
- *Oil is drilled for in the fields of the Uintah Basin.
- *The salt and brine shrimp from the Great Salt Lake bring in billions of dollars for our state.
- *Utah is known for its ski resorts and 'The Greatest Snow on Earth'.
- *Utah has 5 National Parks (Arches, Canyonlands, Bryce, Capitol Reef, and Zion)
